		Lesson Topic	Objectives
1		Intro to Leadership & Empathy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will learn the characteristics of a leader. Students will be able to define empathy. Students will be able to use the SHOE acronym to describe how to show empathy.
2		Awareness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define awareness, awareness of self and awareness of others.
3		Effective Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define effective communication. Students will be able to identify the difference between verbal and nonverbal communication. Students will be able to identify and define the people and responsibilities of each person in the communication process.
4		Community Building	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define community and community building. Students will be able to identify how community builders treat others.
5		Intro to Disability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define disability. Students will discover that each person has the potential to be a leader. Students will be able to identify two way to interact with someone with a disability.
6		Disability History - Part 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to name the law that gave disabled students the right to a free appropriate public education with their non-disabled peers. Students will be able to identify the year the IDEA was passed.
7		Disability History - Part 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to identify the law that protects civil rights for disabled people in their communities. Students will be able to identify the year the ADA was passed.
8		ADA & Accessibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define accessible. Students will be able to identify an example of accessibility in each of the following categories: employment, public services, business, telecommunications and community.



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9		Assistive Technology - Part 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to define assistive technology (AT). Students will be able to identify at least one example of AT for daily activities, school and work and play and recreation.
10		Assistive Technology - Part 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will review the definition of assistive technology. Students will identify at least two examples of assistive technology for communication.
11		Career Options for Disability-Inclusive Leaders & Advocacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will identify at least three careers that provide opportunities to work with people with disabilities. Students will be able to define advocacy. Students will be able to identify at least three examples of advocacy in their community.
12		Final Project Work Day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will select a topic for their final project. Students will know the expectations and guidelines for completing the final project.
13		Final Week	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will present their final projects.
